To maintain a sustainable, livable, safe community for very low, low and moderate income persons.


Department Overview

The Housing and Community Development Department administers local, state and federal funds designed for housing and community development.


Core activities include:

Organizational Chart




Staffing Levels





Key Accomplishments NSP

Funds are used to acquire and rehabilitate foreclosed and abandoned homes within specific target areas of the City. The homes are resold or rented to moderate and low-income households who qualify.

- 25% of the funds are directed to households whose income is less than 50% of the Area Median Income.

Value of Services Provided

- General Funds of \$295,290 will leverage \$5,896,186 of federal and \$1,145,176 of State funding for the provision of programs and activities to meet identified needs in the community:
 - Home ownership
 - Rental and owner occupied housing rehabilitation
 - Public service activities
 - Neighborhood economic development
 - Public facilities and infrastructure improvements, and
 - Assistance to the homeless population and persons with HIV/AIDS

Value of Services Provided



 For every \$1 of General Fund invested we receive \$24 in State and federal funding.
